Membership categories:

I have been asked so many questions about whether someone is eligible to join NCOA, it is clear that many of you are confused. I will do my best to clarify the issue.

My experience as to why people don't recruit members is that either they don't care, or they get so busy they just don't think about it. We need help and you are it!

Regular Division: Anyone who has served honorably in the rank of E1 through E9 in any branch of the military, active, guard or reserve.

Veteran Division: Any officer of any branch of the military, active, guard or reserve.

Auxiliary: Anyone over the age of 18 who is related to someone who would have qualified for regular division status.

That includes spouses, brothers, sisters, nieces, nephews, parents, aunts, uncles, cousins, grandkids. That included pretty much anyone related either directly or indirectly to someone who has served.

Associate Division: People who have never served but support what NCOA does. They can be politicians, business people who support veterans etc.

Korean Medallions: The Medallions recognizing our Korean War Veterans should be available around the first of September. They can be obtained for a donation of \$23 directly from HQ or through the chapter. If you are a Korean veteran or the family of one who has passed, please contact the chapter to arrange for a presentation. There is no cost to the veteran as the chapter raises funds to cover the cost through sponsorships and fund raisers. Let us remember those who served in the "Forgotten War!"

VeteRun: This has been the biggest single fundraising event that the chapter has ever done. In the first 5 years we have raised and given away over \$60,000 and our goal this year is to raise \$20,000. This year we again support Mighty Oaks Foundation which deals with PTSD and suicide prevention, an issue that has cost this country and our veteran population 22 veterans a day at its peak. We are also supporting a charity called David's Chair that provides free access to track chairs that allow wheelchair bound veterans the ability to go to the beach, up in the snow, to go hunting or fishing or play golf or trap shoot. Help us continue this significant legacy! >STOP YOUR IPHONE FROM TRACKING YOU.

- *Settings
- *Privacy
- *Location services
 - *System services
 - *Look for Significant Location
 - *Turn it off and clear history

>HOW TO PUT A FILE NAME ON A FORM TO FIND IT LATER.

- *EXCEL
 - =cell ("filename")
- *Put current date
 - =today()
- *WORD

Insert, header/footer, quick parts, field, file name

>PLACE A SIGNATURE ON A DOCUMENT

- *Take a snap shot of the document, go to pictures and click on edit
 - *Signature button in toolbar, sign with finger
- *Save changed and click done. Signature is placed on document.

>HAVE YOUR IPHONE FLASH FOR INCOMING CALLS*Settings – general – accessibility – hearing *Turn on led flash

Terry Haines, *Chairman*: Terry enlisted in the US Navy for active duty between 1971-1977, honorably discharging as an E5. He then served in the US Naval Reserves between 1982-2006, retiring as a Master Chief Petty Officer (E-9), and he deployed twice for Iraqi Freedom between 2002-2003 and 2005-2006.

Ron Kohl, *Treasurer/Trustee:* Ron served in both the Air Force as a Tech Sergeant, and the Army as a Staff Sergeant before he retired. He also served in law enforcement and is committed to helping locals avoid fraud and scams.

Bud Cordes, *Knight Advisor*. Bud Cordes was a USAF Tech Sergeant who retired after 20 years of service in 1978. He served in Vietnam between 1968-1969.

Paul Mills, *Trustee*: Paul was a SPC in the US Army from 1987 to 1991 and his high point was serving in Berlin when the Berlin Wall came down.

Ken Wilson, *Vice Chair*. Ken served in the United States Navy for 4 years and was honorably discharged as n E-5 Boiler Tech. He served on four ships during his time. The first three he was part of the decommissioning party and he ended his career on board the USS Camden (AOE-2).

David Haines, *Trustee*: David served 24 years in the navy and Navy Reserve and 7 years in the Air Force Reserves where he deployed to Qatar in 2007-8. He achieved the rank of E-6.
