The next version of Medallions commemorating Desert Storm is in the phase of design. I want to thank all of the Rogue Chapter members who have presented Medallions to assist in recognizing the service of our country's veterans. As of this moment we have presented 277 WW2, 40 Korean & 156 Vietnam Medallions and I have no doubt those numbers will continue to increase. You can all be proud because the efforts of the Rogue Chapter have motivated NCOA members all over the country to recognize our veterans. This month we will be providing Medallions to 23 Vietnam veterans on an Honor Flight at the Vietnam Memorial in Washington DC.

In February the Rogue Chapter lost 2 dear friends in Sir Troy Hensley and Charles Buckner. Troy's Memorial service took place in Texas on March 19th and was attended by hundreds from all over the country. One of the speakers was the 13th SgtMaj of the Marine Corps, Gene Overstreet. He received full military honors provided by an Honor Guard of Marines. The event was attended by the current Grand Knight, Sir Paul Siverson, as well as 7 Past Grand Knights that came from all over the country. In April, a Memorial service for Charles Buckner will take place at Eagle Point National Cemetery on 4/14 at 1100. For those local to southern Oregon, you are encouraged to attend to honor a great friend & NCOA Life member.

Your Rogue Chapter is supporting our national organization by having a recruiting drive between now and the end of June. Regular membership is normally \$30 but if you recruit a new member, it will only cost \$20 providing you process the application back through the chapter so that we can make up the difference. Auxiliary membership normally costs \$20 and during this drive it only costs \$15. This is only for new members, and they can use a credit card on our Chapter website <u>https://ncoarogue.org</u> and complete an application on the membership tab. Applications can be submitted with a check to NCOA, PO Box 5597, Central Point, OR 97502. Your chapter will make up the difference.

Auxiliary Members are encouraged to apply for a \$500 Bettsy Ross grant through the NCOA website at <u>https://ncoausa.org</u>. It can be used to take classes for education or self-improvement.

Medallions: We are still going strong with WW2 Medallions, but we now have Korean as well as Vietnam Medallions available. The Korean and Vietnam Medallions cost us \$23 each. We have been raising funds to purchase medallions. We do not charge the recipient for the medallions. These medallions are our way of honoring the service and sacrifice of our veterans. If one of these period veterans has passed away, we can still present one to the family to honor the veteran's service and to give the family something to pass down to educate the younger generation about the honored veteran. Can you help by identifying veterans to recognize or perhaps identify funding sources so that we can honor those who have served? To date we have awarded at least 267 WW2, 31 Korean & 131 Vietnam.

Meeting Dates change: For the months of April through June we will hold out meeting on the 2nd Saturday at the VFW in Medford as we have ceremonies to attend for Medallion presentations on each of the first Saturdays.

Legislative Resolution help needed. Each chapter is being asked to see if there is someone interested in the legislative process that can not only keep the chapter updated on current legislative matters but also participate on the National Resolution Committee. That committee meets on Zoom most of the year and at conference once a year. If interested, please let Chairman Haines know ASAP.

Conference 2023: Next year's conference will be in San Antonio down on the Riverwalk instead of out by the airport. Plans are in the works to make this a family friendly event with some surprise events. It is not too early to pencil this conference in your schedule. We hope to keep our string of Chapter of the Year going, so make plans to attend. Registration is only \$200 if you sign up prior to May 31st. If you are a Vanguard Life Member, you save 20% off the registration.

Membership Drive: Rogue Chapter's goal for recruiting by the End of June is 50 new members in any category. To help provide incentive, a normal \$30 1-yr regular membership will be \$20 and a normal \$20 auxiliary membership will be \$15. The key will be to either recruit a new member through our chapter website using a credit card so that the application and payment come to the chapter or mail the application with a check to our PO Box 5597, Central Point, OR 97502. If you have a spouse, child, or grandchild over the age of 18, they are eligible for membership in the auxiliary for only \$15. Please help us stay the "Best Large Chapter in NCOA" for another year by signing up at least 1 new member. Since January 1st, we have recruited at least 15 new members and recovered a few lapsed members. We are still 35 new members shy of our goal. Can you help?

Mercy Flights: We have teamed up with the Marine Corps League to form a group for Mercy Flights. If you don't use this service during the year, it becomes a tax-deductible contribution. The group only covers Jackson County for air & ground & Josephine County for air only. A ground ambulance can run up to \$2,000 and God forbid you needed an air ambulance to Portland, the cost soars to over \$20,000 & Mercy Flight will take whatever your insurance will pay. It is a great benefit. Family costs for a year are around \$68 and if they can get another 5 members, the cost per family could drop another \$5.

Attention Auxiliary Members: The Bettsy Ross Grants in the amount of \$500 are a huge benefit for being a member of the Auxiliary. They can be used to take a class or other self-improvement opportunity. 8 are available each year and have not been being used. Go to the national website under Benevolent Programs to apply. No one has yet applied this year. You just need to be a paid-up auxiliary member.

April 2023 Security Tip

Are Public Wi-Fi Networks Safe? What You Need To Know

Public Wi-Fi networks, or hotspots, in coffee shops, malls, airports, hotels, and other places are convenient. In the early days of the internet, they often weren't secure. But things have changed. Here's what you need to know about your safety when you connect to a public Wi-Fi network.

How You Know Your Information Is Safe When You're Using a Public Wi-Fi Network

In the past, if you used a public Wi-Fi network to get online, your information was at risk. That's because most websites didn't use encryption to scramble the data and protect it from hackers snooping on the network.

Today, most websites **do** use encryption to protect your information. Because of the widespread use of encryption, connecting through a public Wi-Fi network is usually safe.

How do you know your connection is encrypted? Look for a lock symbol or https in the address bar to the left of the website address. This works on a mobile browser, too. It can be hard to tell if a mobile app uses encryption, but the majority do.

How To Keep Your Password Secure

- Make sure your password is long and strong. That means at least 12 characters. Making a
 password longer is generally the easiest way to make it stronger. Consider using a
 passphrase of random words so that your password is more memorable, but avoid
 using common words or phrases.
- Don't reuse passwords you've used on other accounts. if a hacker gets your password for one account, they can't use it to get into your other accounts.
- Pick security questions only you know the answer to. Don't use questions with a limited number of responses that attackers can easily guess — like the color of your first car. You can even use nonsense answers to make guessing more difficult — but if you do, make sure you can remember what you use.
- Change passwords quickly if there's a breach. If a company tells you there was a data breach where a hacker could have gotten your password, change the password you use with that company right away. Do not change one number of letter in the previous password. It is recommended to use a totally new password.

He then served in the US Naval Reserves between 1982-2006, retiring as a Master Chief Petty Officer (E-9), and he deployed twice for Iraqi Freedom between 2002-2003 and 2005-2006.

Ron Kohl, *Treasurer/Trustee*: Ron served in both the Air Force as a Tech Sergeant, and the Army as a Staff Sergeant before he retired. He also served in law enforcement and is committed to helping locals avoid fraud and scams.

Bud Cordes, *Knight Advisor*: Bud Cordes was a USAF Tech Sergeant who retired after 20 years of service in 1978. He served in Vietnam between 1968-1969.

Kris Stevens, *Trustee*: Kris served in the Coast Guard as a Machinery Technician 2nd class, E-5, from 1975 to 1979. He served the majority of his enlistment at a small boat rescue station at the northwest tip of the Washington Olympic peninsula.

Ken Wilson, *Vice Chair*. Ken served in the United States Navy for 4 years and was honorably discharged as n E-5 Boiler Tech. He served on four ships during his time. The first three he was part of the decommissioning party and he ended his career on board the USS Camden (AOE-2).

David Haines, *Trustee:* David served 24 years in the navy and Navy Reserve and 7 years in the Air Force Reserves where he deployed to Qatar in 2007-8. He achieved the rank of E-6.
